A Message from our Pastor

Who Defines Us?

In Matthew's Gospel, it is quite interesting to note the reaction of the chief priests and scribes to

Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem and especially his cleansing the temple. Their response is to attempt to trap Him in His own words. They have a number of attempts at putting Jesus under their authority. Here I want to point out their first attempt. They question His authority by coming up to Him and simply asking the question: "By what authority are you doing these things, and who gave you this authority?"

Jesus gives an intriguing answer. He does not just say, "My Father!" but instead He asks them a question. His question is quite simple: "I also will ask you one question, and if you tell me the answer, then I also will tell you by what authority I do these things. The baptism of John, from where did it come? From heaven or from man?"

Now Jesus knew the thoughts of their hearts. They discussed it among themselves and considered the outcome of their answer. If they say that John was from God, Jesus will ask why they didn't believe him. But if they say John was from man they could have more problems on their hands with the people because they held him to be a prophet. So, they answered Jesus' question with the simple, "We do not know!"

At this point, I think it is important for us to ask this question concerning ourselves. Who defines us? Or as Jesus says, "From where do we come? From heaven or from man?" When we gather together as a church are we merely an earthly gathering of folks or are we gathered for a greater purpose. This is not a trick question! The answer is obvious. We are from God- baptized into Christ death and resurrection and receiving Christ's very body and blood given for our forgiveness.

Yes, we at Trinity Lutheran Church are made up of sinful human beings. At the same time, however, God defines us as His people through His Son, Jesus. Our sins are done away with by Jesus' death on the cross. We are given life eternal by the One who is our life. So, who defines us as the people in Sealy at Trinity Lutheran Church?

The answer to the simple question is complex. On the one hand we are our parents' children. We come from human descent and as men and women we are covered in sin. Yet on the other hand, we come from God because He has called us to faith in Jesus through Baptism and given us forgiveness and life.






The Sealy Christian Food

Pantry is always looking out for children during the holidays who do not have enough to eat. The Pantry, Trinity Lutheran Church, and the Preschool come together to help by donating food items specifically for children. It is the Christian responsibility of the congregation, Preschool, and parents to teach the little ones about need, hunger, and generosity. There are families out there that are not making ends meet and sometimes food is short changed to make the rent. Through our church families and preschool families, we can guide our students by helping them pick out food that they like and would like to share with those who are not as fortunate as they are.

Suggestions from the Sealy Christian Food Pantry are: peanut butter, jelly, small individual cereal breakfast packs, pop tarts, Chef Boyardee microwavable little meals, ramen noodles, mac and cheese microwave cups, containers of readymade jello, puddings, peaches, fruit cups, apple sauce, boxes of small individual chips, little Debbie muffins, little Debbie snacks or whatever your child or kids will eat. You can place your items in the wheelbarrow that is located as you walk through the double glass doors. We will continue collecting through the month of October and into the third week of November. I have a large box that Ms. Robin and I will fill when the wheel barrel is overflowing. Sue Kristynik or someone from the Food Pantry will come by and pick up the food before the Thanksgiving holidays. Depending on how much is collected with the food they need can help feed children during the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays. Let's all work and fill many boxes to help these children who are hungry.

Preschool Open House will take place on Wednesday, October 23rd 6:00 pm - 7:00 pm. Everyone is invited to attend this event, including the

congregation. Parents you may bring grandparents, aunts, uncles, friends, and family. This is a great time for everyone to come together and see some of the work the children have completed and for the families and friends to visit classrooms and teachers. Here are my Open House Night suggestions for parents from a teacher's point of view. Go early. This evening is somewhat social, and you might want time to chat with other parents. The preschool teachers and their classrooms are on display. Make this a positive experience for your child and everyone.

Western Day! On Tuesday, October 8th, the children may dress in western clothes for Western Day to promote Austin County Fair. Each child may dress in western jeans, boots, shirts, belts, hats, and a bandana. If your child decides to wear spurs, this is fine, except if they are hurting another child, then the spurs will be removed. Let's get out our cowboy hats and boots!



Gun Safety! On Wednesday, October 16th, Retired Trooper Gary Pflughaupt will come to the preschool to talk to the children about

Gun Safety. Mr. Gary, as the children call him, knows that a lot of children go hunting with their dads and grandpas and would like to keep the little ones safe. Mr. Gary will also explain to the children the importance of what to do if you find a gun, for example, at a friend's house. What do you do with a gun? Mr. Gary will also talk about how to use play guns and not to point guns at others. Let's see what the children can learn during Gun Safety!

Wear Blue Day! Since we are learning blue for the month, we would like the children to wear something BLUE to preschool on Friday, October 18th. Children can wear blue clothes, socks, shoes, hair bows, neckties or whatever you can think of to reinforce blue!

Fire Prevention! The Sealy Fire Department will come to the preschool on Friday, October 25th at 10:00 am. They will teach the children to stop, drop and roll in case of a fire. Children will enjoy the morning with the Sealy Fire Department as they learn about Fire Safety, since October is Fire Prevention Month. One of the important things that the firemen will teach the children is not to be afraid of them or hide from them in case they are in a burning house. Firemen are

there to help and rescue them even though their equipment may be scary. The firemen will also teach the children how important an escape route is for the entire family and the importance of smoke detectors. This is an important lesson, please try to have your child at school.

Harvest Party! The preschool Harvest Party for the entire preschool will be Wednesday, October 30th 9:30 am-10:30 am. We would like the children to come dressed as one of Noah Ark's animals. We have in the past had great and unique costumes, such as ladybugs, puppy dogs, sheep, kitty cats, cows, and lots more. There are so many simple ways to dress your child as an animal without spending a lot of money.

There will be a sign-up list for refreshments and games. We need parents to help in supervising the children with games that the preschool provides. I will need help with setting up, tearing down, wiping tables and chairs, sweeping, and cleaning the kitchen after the party.

If you can help with games or refreshments, please place your name on the sign-up list. Only parents that sign up to help with the party by supervising activity stations can attend. Whoever signs up first will be able to come and help with the party. We will have more parties throughout the year for you to participate.

Carving Pumpkin Day We will carve pumpkins on Friday, November 1st. The preschoolers will have a blast to help clean out the pumpkin and listen how God uses a pumpkin. Not only does God wash us clean from the outside, but he also removes our sin, and in doing that we are washed clean and made new from the inside out. This is a new creation, a jack-o-lantern, with a joy-filled face. Jesus does that with us.

Themes for the month of October are Family, Fire, Fall, Leaves, Harvest and Pumpkins. The color for the month is BLUE, the shapes are circle and rectangle, and the children will continue to learn the letters i m, f, s, a, and d. We teach the children the sounds and names of these letters. Using picture boxes or object boxes helps the children to recognize the name and sounds to the first batch of letters to begin putting silly words together. Children will continue learning gotogethers, matching, categorizing etc.

Social Focus for the preschoolers will be thankful that God loves and protects us our family and friends. Family and God and how

to be obedient to our parents, loving each other unconditionally, contributing to the household and how these values reflect God's values for people. Following directions is one of the most important social skills that children develop. Be it in the classroom, at home with the family or on the sporting field, a child who can listen, understand, and then follow instructions and directions will go a long way.

New Business


