

Thanksgiving in the Midst of Criticism

1 Chronicles chapter fourteen records how King

David defeated the Philistines that threatened the people of Israel. But as we all know, the Philistines still remained an issue for David and the people he served and ruled. This chapter ends with the attitude that many had toward King David: And the fame of David went out into all lands, and the Lord brought the fear of him upon all nations.

It is in the next chapter that David builds a house for himself and then pitches a tent for the ark of the covenant. You know, that important box that held manna, Aaron's rod, and the covenant itself. David is then described as joyfully and in a worship style, bringing the ark of the covenant into the city of Jerusalem. Now one would only think that David would be admired by everyone for the defeat of their enemy but this was not the case.


At the end of 1 Chronicles 15, there is a note about how Michal, the daughter of the former king, Saul, felt about King David. "And as the ark of the covenant of the LORD came to the city of David, Michal the daughter of Saul looked out of the window and saw King David dancing and celebrating, and she <u>despised</u> him in her heart."

If that were us, we would probably not be in the best of moods, knowing that someone out there despised us. That is not the attitude David had however. Instead, the next chapter teaches us a lesson on giving thanks because that's exactly what King David did. He didn't try to appease Michal's affection. No, he praised and thanked God for His goodness to him.

All too often, we tend to do the opposite. We want recognition and to be liked by everyone. But we forget that is unrealistic. Instead of finding the approval of everyone, David understood where his strength came from. It came from God and not from his people or even his critics. So, David then gives thanks, even under the circumstance of criticism: (1 Chronicles 16:8–13)

Oh give thanks to the Lord; call upon his name; make known his deeds among the peoples! Sing to him, sing praises to him; tell of all his wondrous works! Glory in his holy name; let the hearts of those who seek the Lord rejoice! Seek the Lord and his strength; seek his presence continually! Remember the wondrous works that he has done, his miracles and the judgments he uttered, O offspring of Israel his servant, children of Jacob, his chosen ones!

<u>Pumpkin Carving!</u> Since we are through with the pumpkins from the party, we will do pumpkin carving. Children will learn the story of the Pumpkin Gospel. As we are carving the pumpkin we tell the preschoolers that all of us are like pumpkins and God is the gardener. The preschoolers will learn how we have yucky sin inside of us. As we are cleaning out all the yucky, gooey, stuff inside the pumpkin is letting the preschoolers know that Jesus wants to clean out our sins that we have in our hearts.

Once the pumpkin is clean with a new face, now we can place a light in the pumpkin to make it shine. God gives us His light to shine through us. Preschoolers learn that God clean out our sin by believing that Jesus, God's Son died to pay the price for our sins. He turns us into new creations that shine for Him. And when others ask about our light, you can tell them the story of the Pumpkin Gospel to clean their hearts so they can shine.

Wear Green Day! Since we are learning green for the month, we would like the children to wear something GREEN to preschool on Friday, November 8th. Children can wear green clothes, socks, shoes, hair bows, neckties or whatever you can think of to reinforce green.

Friendsgiving Day! Friendsgiving is our preschoolers and teachers gathering to celebrate Thanksgiving. We are learning about Feast and Friendship and would like the preschoolers to have Friendsgiving Day among themselves. This will be a small Thanksgiving Celebration of giving thanks to each other.

Look for a note that will be sent home to help purchase some of the items needed for Friendsgiving Day. We would like to have all the items be here on Friday, November 15th. On Wednesday, November 20th the preschoolers will mix the items brought in for their Friendsgiving Day Celebration and enjoy their friendship meal.
