Christmas Communication The barber had been cutting hair for

many years in his small town. Of course,

that meant he had shared many stories and jokes. Some of those jokes and stories were funny and some were the ones that needed to stay in the barber shop. He would many times be the one to tell a rude and crude joke and think nothing about it.

One day, one of his customers invited him to go to an old-fashioned revival meeting in a tent, outside of town. The barber reluctantly went after being chided by the customer time and time again throughout the previous week. The barber had never seen anything like it. All the people there were praying for each other and singing and praising God. He was moved so he wanted to get baptized that very night.

So the day following his gloriously saving event, he wanted to share his new faith to someone. He wanted to witness to the lost and he figured his shop should be the place to start. His first customer of the morning came in. The barber invited him up into his chair and so the customer did so. Meanwhile the barber was trying hard to muster up the words to speak. He lathered up the shaving cream and put it on the man's face. Then he sharpened his single blade razor. He then started shaving the man. That's when he got the nerve to say something and share about his last night's experience.

As he stood there with his razor poised over the man's throat to shave him, he asked the customer the simple question, "Are you prepared to meet God?"

Communication and the right timing are important for sharing the good news of Jesus. That included both verbal and nonverbal communication of the gospel. The Bible reminds us that at just the right time, God sent His Son into our world to save us poor, miserable sinners.

Notice all throughout the Christmas story found in the first two chapters of Luke how much communication happens: angels appear and speak, Mary and Elizabeth talk about pregnancy and their children to come, angels communicate the birth of Jesus to shepherds, and shepherds in turn then communicate what they saw and heard.

At Christmas God truly communicates to us His great love for us. He could have but didn't sit on the sidelines and do nothing or say nothing. Instead, He took the initiative and sent His Son, Jesus, to enter our world. He communicates both verbally and non-verbally His love through Jesus' birth, life, teaching, healing, death, and resurrection. He then calls us to share or communicate His love for all people.
