The preschool budget committee is meeting on Tuesday, February 4th to consider our budget for the

2025-2026 school year. Our fiscal budget runs with the school months September 1st to August 31st not from January to December. There have been a lot of

questions about the Preschool budget and the amount of money that we have available. The money we have is still the Grant money that we were awarded. We have been careful with our spending to allow reserves to build so we will not have to worry should some catastrophic event happen again. The Preschool runs on the preface that our tuition should pay for teacher and staff salaries. In that regard, we use fund raiser monies for scholarships and items to help teachers do their jobs better. We also try to save money for emergencies and long-range goals. The playground equipment was a long-range goal that the preschool saved up for many years before they had over \$18,000.00 to purchase it. The shredded tire cost of \$10,0000 to resurface our fall zone on the playground took us a while to save. The money in our checking account at this moment will have to see us through until the first tuition that comes in September of 2025. We pay salaries for 12 months of the year even when no tuition is coming in from May until September. We also have our regular monthly bills to cover as well as ordering supplies that will see us through the 2025-2026 school year.

Our goal for this year is to fill the seats in the classrooms. We want to see the love of the Lord and children's Christian education begin with Trinity Lutheran Preschool. With the economy being so bad for several years we have had many more people looking for scholarships. The Elders of the church graciously sponsor a child each year and so do the Preschool. We have had several private sponsors who have helped in the past when the need arose. Our fund raiser How Much Do You Love the Preschool is strictly going toward scholarships. We hope to double the available scholarships this year (the parents pay half price) and if we can, and offer even more if the funds come in. Students must qualify through a questionnaire, and they must attend all 5 days.

Trinity Lutheran Preschool appreciates the members of Trinity for supporting us in the good years and the lean. When we had to close for a year due to Covid and then start back up; You voted to support us through the process. We were so blessed that we didn't need to ask the church for money to get through. The Grant has helped us to remodel 5 of the classrooms and help with other projects in the church. We have been able to pay our bills and our teachers and staff. We pray that we will be sustained through many more years to offer the word of the Lord our Savior and a wonderful Christian based education to the children of this community.

Scholarship Program **Fundraising!** For the month of February, we are raising money for scholarships for the 2025-2026 school

year. We would like to have more families attend Trinity if we can get a little help from you.

You can donate a monetary gift to help families that are struggling. Whether you donate \$5, \$10 or whatever you can to help us reach \$3000 for two children that can attend as half scholarships. The parents pay the other half. The cost of one child attending with half a scholarship is \$1,575.00. We would like to raise enough money each year for at least two or more scholarships to be added to the preschool budaet.

We are grateful for the half scholarship support that our Church Elders give towards one child to attend from the community in sharing the love of Jesus. An envelope will be provided to express the love you have for Trinity Lutheran Preschool.

You can make the check out to Trinity Lutheran Preschool or for church members, you may make your check out to Trinity Lutheran Church and designate it to (Preschool Scholarship Program) to have your donation recorded in offerings for year-end statement. I would like to say thank you in advance to help a child know about Jesus.

Themes for the month of Themes! February are Hygiene, Dental and Health. Preschoolers will learn the importance of keeping their body clean every day and include washing their hands after using the restroom. Along with the hygiene lessons they will learn the importance of brushing and flossing their teeth and covering their mouths and noses with a tissue when sneezing or coughing. Also washing hands after handling pets or other animals.

They will learn the proper nutrition and how exercise can keep you healthy. Teachers will talk to the children about health items such as soap, combs, brushes, toothpaste, toothbrushes and many more items that will keep you healthy.

Kid's Dentistry! Since the themes for February are Dental, Health, and Hygiene, Kid's Dentistry is coming to the preschool on Friday, February 28th at 10:00 am. They will

explain to the preschoolers the importance of keeping their teeth healthy and why we see a dentist. They will show them the correct way to brush and floss their teeth and the reason behind keeping your teeth healthy.
